21 October 1898. A meeting of the School Committee held in the evening respecting the overcrowding of the Infants' room.

1899 Have arranged for Infant boys to be taught in the larger room on Tuesday and Thursday afternoons from 1.30 to 2.45 p.m. during the time that the girls are taking Needlework in the classroom. Monitress to assist in the large room.

Government Report. Infants' Class. This class has been taught under difficulties arising mainly from habitual overcrowding.

30 June 1899. Annual distribution of prizes and certificates given by Managers for regular attendance. 2 pupils had not missed a single attendance during the past 4 years, 1 pupil for 3 years and 3 for 2 years.

17 November 1899. Several boys absent today bush beating.

15 December 1899. The open fireplace in the Mixed School and store in the classroom now used in place of hot water pipes have proved very successful during this severe weather.

1900 H.M.I. Report 1900. Mixed School. The School is going on well. Both discipline and instruction are satisfactory. Infants' Class. Infants only are now taught in the classroom consequently the work is carried on with greater ease than formerly. The teaching seems to be improving and the highest variable Grant is again recommended.

One pupil has now not missed an attendance during the past 5 years.

11 May 1900. A children's entertainment was given last night and owing to its success will be repeated tonight, the proceeds being directed to the School's Funds.

September 1900. A new set of slates obtained for Standards I and II.
